William Reynell, of Dorsetshire.

Quarterly Meeting at Dorchester, 25th 4th mo., 1690:— And be it noted that since our last Quarterly Meeting it has pleased the Lord to remove from us by death our honest, worthy Friend, Wm. Keynell, of the Isle of Purbeck, who received a gift of the ministry several years before his decease, and faithfully laboured therein according to the ability which God gave him, he being the only minister which was then had in the county, and was well beloved by his friends. And as a manifestation of his love to them in the Truth, he gave, by will, a considerable estate of land for the use and benefit of poor Friends of this county, with £10 in money, who, with us, have cause to remember him for his charitable gift to them. And we doubt not that he laid down his head in peace with the Lord, whom he loved according to his measure.²
