Our will & pleasure is That you cause apprehend the persons of Colonell David Barclay, Sr James Steuart sometimes Provost of Edinbr, & Wallace sometimes Lieutenant Colonell of our foot guard in Scotland And them & every one of them you committ into sure prisons in some of our Castles of Edinbr, Sterlin or Dumbarton There to remaine untill you receave our further orders For w^{ch} this shalbe yo^r warrant Given at our Court at Salisbury the 23 of August 1665 & of our reign the 17th year
